
Ans. Tom's Granny is 58 years old

First child born: Granny is 19



3. How many triangles are there in this diagram?




Ans: 64 Triangles


4. An old Mathematics book contained this addition sum. What were the three missing numbers?






5. If you continue shading the squares so that the two dotted lines become lines of symmetry (mirror lines) of the completed diagram, how many squares will be left unshaded?




Ans: The number of squares left is then 9.






Ans: 8 moves, like this:




7. In this diagram, 11 matches make 3 squares. Your challenge is to move 3 matches to show 2 squares.
