
1. Using only addition, how do you add eight 8s and get the number 1,000?

4. Which number replaces the question mark?




- A. 111

$$(4 + 0 + 8) * 2 = 24$$

$$(5 + 5 + 5) * 2 = 30$$

Answer: 6


Find the difference of first two numbers in each row and double it to get third number in that row.

$$11-2 = 9*2 = 18$$

$$5-2 = 3*2 = 6$$

$$12-5 = 7*2 = 14$$
